

# From the Board: New Building Update

We've made progress on our new building plans, and we want to keep you in the loop. Here's a quick update on where things stand:

#### What's Happened So Far

In the last six months, the project design team have spent time adjusting the positioning of the new facility to minimise shadowing and other effects of the Liston Park neighbours. We met with the Council to discuss our plans, and they were generally happy with both the scale and layout of the building. They provided constructive suggestions on materiality and visual impact, which we have subsequently incorporated.

#### What's Changed

Based on the feedback, we've made some changes to the design:

- We've articulated the external steel cladding to provide a variance in colour and break up the blank façade.
- On the southern side we've relocated the service ducts lower on the wall to make them less noticeable.
- The public toilets have been moved to a more visible spot near the entrance, so they're easier to find.
- We've made small changes to our internal layouts to make the space more efficient.

To view the building design check out the noticeboard next time you're at the gym.

#### **Next Steps**

• With the changes noted above, we'll carry out a cost-check of our current design in order to keep within our previously-indicated budget.



- We've begun providing quarterly update reports to Auckland Council as part of our Development Funding Agreement, and the new board is keen to meet with our Council representative to establish new relationships.
- The Board has endorsed the proposal to progress with the submission of our Resource Consent application. All going well, we are anticipating this application will take about six months to process.
- The next major focus area is funding. We are developing a strategy for how we'll source the remaining funds for the project, and obtaining these funds will be our primary focus in 2025.

We're excited about the progress we've made and will keep you updated as we move forward. If you have any questions, or wish to contribute, don't hesitate to reach out!

# From the Board: ESGC Member Survey Results – thanks for your feedback!

Thank you so much to the 73 members that took the time to complete our member survey last term! It's clear that we all care deeply about the future of our club, and your feedback will be invaluable in helping us shape that future.

Starting with some key highlights, on a scale of 1 (highly unsatisfied) to 5 (highly satisfied) we're pleased to share that 69 of the 73 respondents rated the **value for money** of our programmes and classes as 3 or above. When it comes to **coaching**, 68 respondents rated the quality at 3 or above, with 15 awarding a perfect 5. In terms of the **quality of classes**, 69 respondents rated them at 3 or above. While all these scores are very encouraging, it also highlights opportunities for improvement including support our coaches further in their professional development, ensuring we consistently deliver the highest standards across the board.

We received some lovely comments about our **coaches**, especially their dedication and efforts to engage with the children. While we're proud of the positive feedback, we know there's always room for improvement, particularly in communication and support.

Moving on to the areas where we can improve, as a Board we'd like to acknowledge the feedback regarding our **facility**. We understand that there's a desire for enhancements, but given our current constraints, we need to be mindful of balancing any significant upgrades with our plans to relocate to new premises. While we're limited in what we can do right now, we'll continue to make improvements where possible.

Another key theme that emerged was the need for **better communication and professionalism** from our administration team. We hear your concerns loud and clear, and as a Board, we're making this a top priority as you will have seen in our Board update sent on Tuesday 17 September. We're working closely with our Centre Manager to ensure that our communication and customer service meet the high standards you expect.

Building a stronger **club culture** and fostering a greater sense of community was another important area raised. We would love for parents and members to feel more connected and engaged. That's why the whānau of ESGC Facebook group was created by Andrea and Jess, to bring our community closer together. We encourage you to join the group and be part of the conversation as we work towards building a stronger club culture.

To wrap up, we want to thank you all again for your valuable feedback. Your input is vital in helping us grow and improve as a club. Rest assured that we're committed to taking your feedback on board and working towards making ESGC the best it can be for all our members. We plan to do our next member survey in around six months' time to check how we're progressing as a club, but please feel free to provide feedback at any time.

# Farewell to Jemma

Finally, next week marks the end of an era, as we say a very reluctant farewell to Jemma Cronin.

Jemma has been at ESGC for sixteen years, since she was just two years old! She is one of our most successful gymnasts, having reached STEP 10 and competed internationally. As a Coach and a member of our ESGC community she is universally respected and very much loved. (Jemma's mother Sarah has also made an exceptional contribution to the club over many years, but she wants this to be just about Jemma!).

Jemma has been a model of personal excellence, kindness, and dedication. Jemma and her family are moving home to Australia for their next chapter. As sad as we are to say goodbye, we know that Jemma has a sparkling future ahead. Thank you Jemma for everything. We will miss you so much, but hope we'll see you back for visits!



Here's Jemma's ESGC journey in her own words:

I began my gymnastics journey at ESGC when I was just two years old, starting with play gym classes alongside my brother. From the very beginning, I fell in love with the sport and it quickly became the biggest part of my life. At age five, I joined a recreational class, and in 2013, I was invited to join the competitive program. My first competition was in 2014, where I competed in step two.

In 2018, I qualified for my first national championships in step five, representing Auckland. I finished second overall and became the national vault and bar champion. That same year, ESGC sent step 5+ to the New South Wales State Championships in Sydney, where we won first place overall and were also the vault champions. The following year, I was the top qualifier for Auckland in step six and competed at nationals, finishing second overall and as the national floor champion. After a year of Covid lockdowns and training via Zoom, I competed in step nine in 2021. I placed second at nationals (sensing a pattern here?) and again was the national floor champion.

After the three-month lockdown, during which we trained at Glover Park and the ESGC car park, we were all thrilled to return to the gym. During this period, I was honoured to be chosen as the ESGC Community Ambassador. In this role, I organized two Christmas Can Drives for the Glen Innes Family Centre in 2021 and 2022. I also launched the Big Sister – Little Sister program, pairing senior gymnasts with a junior group for weekly coaching sessions, helping to inspire the next generation of gymnasts. In 2022, I competed in step 10 at nationals and broke my "second place" streak, finishing third overall and winning my final national floor title. I also qualified to represent New Zealand at two international events in Hawaii in 2023. It was an incredible way to conclude my competitive gymnastics career, and I had the best time with my teammates and making friends with gymnasts from the US, Japan, and Canada.

In 2023, after undergoing two ankle surgeries, I made the decision to retire from competitive gymnastics. I shifted my focus to coaching a group of step ones and earned my elementary judging qualification. This year, I have had the joy of guiding my girls through step two, watching them grow, improve and succeed has been one of the most rewarding experiences of my time at ESGC.

As a kid, you are told that time flies, but I never truly believed it until now. Looking back on my 15 years at ESGC, I am reminded of the incredible experiences I have had and the joy that being a gymnast brought to my life. The skills I've learned, the sacrifices I've made, and the friends I've formed are a testament to my love and dedication to this sport, making it difficult to see this chapter come to an end. I see parts of myself in my coaches and my own gymnasts and the relationships I have made throughout the years are so incredibly special and I will treasure them forever. I want to thank my coaches who taught me to never give up, my parents who have supported me wholeheartedly and my friends who always made the long, hard trainings a little easier. I will miss ESGC so much, as gymnastics has influenced every part of who I am, but I am so grateful for everything it has taught me, and I will cherish these memories forever.



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
